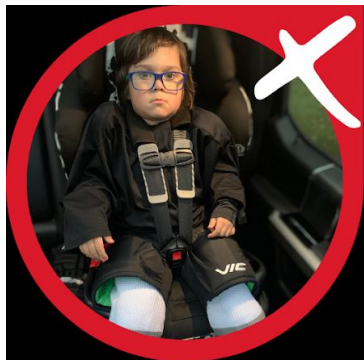

The Board of Directors of the Child Passenger Safety Association of Canada (CPSAC) wants to thank the many members who reached out via posts, messages and emails to share concerns about Hockey Canada's return to hockey protocols, as they relate to transporting players to arenas in full or partial gear. We heard you, and we share your concerns.

Yesterday, CPSAC submitted a letter to members of Hockey Canada's Board of Directors, outlining the ways in which the current directives could put young players at risk for serious injury, and offering CPSAC's support to correct any misinformation to caregivers.

This letter was augmented with supporting documents including Vancouver Island Car Seat Technicians post, [Hockey Gear & Car Seats](#), and resources shared with us through Melissa Brabant and the Ontario Ministry of Transportation including this article, [Gearing Up For The Season](#).
